

## Blooming Timetable of Native Plants for Native Insect Pollinators in the Southern Willamette Valley, Oregon

Color bars approximate flower color (O = white) and flowering time in “normal” weather cycles. Flowering may occur early or might be prolonged with irrigation. **Bold face** type indicates species that are especially good nectar plants for pollinators. Provide blossoms throughout the season if possible.
